Background information	The current contract awarded to Greenspace Construction Inc. for the replacement of the Reid Side Road Culvert is \$237,020 (original award of \$230,284 awarded on PDA-041-19 plus \$6,736 in change orders to-date, exclusive of HST).				
	This contract increase of \$26,982 (exclusive of HST) is for the work to complete the permanent line painting, guiderail reinstatement and replacement of wooden posts that were determined to be unsuitable for re-use. All other work on the project (culvert removal and replacement, landscaping, and paving) was completed in the Fall of 2019. This remaining work will bring the project to final completion.				
	Staff proceeded with the work not to incur any delay claim costs. The new contract total will be \$264,002 (exclusive of HST).

	This contract increase in the amount of \$5,506 (exclusive of HST) is for two (2) additional stormwater management ponds that were not included in the original scope of inventory.		
	The new contract total will be in the amount of \$165,660 (exclusive of HST).		
	Budget Amendment The original budget for this project was \$87,975. The award of the project required a budget amendment in the amount of \$78,086 that was approved through CAO delegated authority and reported to Council through CORS-028-19 Schedule B. A later change order on the project in the amount of \$12,887 was made through CAO delegated authority in accordance with Budget Management Policy No. 113 resulting in a revised budget of \$178,948.		
	Staff are requesting a further \$40,000 budget amendment funded from the Project Variance Account in order to complete the project. This budget amendment is required to fund the internal staff management costs associated with the project. This would bring the overall project budget to \$218,948.
