Background information	Macaulay Shiomi Howson Ltd. was under an original contract with the Town to produce a Secondary Plan for the MEV and manage all of the required background studies in support of the plan in a total award amount of \$331,446 (exclusive of HST). In June of 2017, Council approved an increase to the MEV Secondary Planning capital project (C90017012) in the total amount of \$335,686 (exclusive of HST) to further the Milton Education Village Secondary Plan program and implementation strategy, for a total contract amount of \$667,132 (exclusive of HST). Council also approved under a different contract an extension for Amec Foster Wheeler Environment Infrastructure (now named Wood Environment and Infrastructure Limited) to update the environmental and storm water support work, in the total amount of \$109,985 (exclusive of HST).					
	The Town re-initiated the planning program for the MEV in 2017 and received endorsement from Council on a land use concept. Shortly thereafter, the provincial government withdrew its funding for post-secondary education. Since that time, staff has been in close contact with both Sir Wilfrid Laurier University and Conestoga College who are now working with various partners to deliver a post-secondary presence at the MEV. Planning staff will be forwarding a finalized Secondary Plan for Council's consideration before the end of 2020. As a result of on-going technical review by Halton Region, the following additional studies are required: 1. Air Quality Study - \$18,500 (exclusive of HST). 2. 	The original award resulted from a competitive tender proc through the Halton Cooperative Purchasing Group (HC contract with Milton serving as the lead agency. The cont awarded considered a 5-year term, which was comprised of original 3-year award and 2 additional single year renewals.				
	Based on the satisfactory completion of the first 3 years, terms for a renewal have been negotiated with the vendor. After three years of inflationary changes in contract pricing i.e. 2.0% per year), the pricing for the additional years reflects increases of 10% and 6% per year. These higher amounts are reflective of freight and production costs increasing more than the rate of inflation, since the bid was issued in 2017. Staff researched tendered prices by other municipalities and the proposed changes for the HCPG contract, still provided best value to the group. This contract also allows the agencies to take advantage of an early fill rate each summer, which provides savings to the annual rate.

As a result, of the investigation, it was determined that the City of Toronto co-operative contract provided the best value, to the HCPG.

The potential savings for the HCPG as a whole is in the total annual estimated amount of \$309,829. exclusive of HST).
