EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report is being submitted to have Council's authorization on the various items on the attached Schedules. Requests are being made as per the guidelines outlined in the Purchasing By-law No. 061-2018 and the Budget Management Policy (Policy No.113).

REPORT

Background

Procurement of goods and services is governed by By-law No. 061-2018. Purchasing activity is undertaken in a manner that is intended to support the Town's mandate to provide effective, responsible government and efficiently deliver services to the residents of Milton.

Discussion

Information pertaining to the recommended purchasing awards is included on the corresponding Schedules (A to H) attached.

This report includes the single source awards to a number of suppliers listed in detail in Appendix G. Staff are requesting the ability to issue purchase orders to these suppliers for requirements within the approved budgets. Contracts for these suppliers have been previously approved by Council on a single source basis, and the awards



recommended herein allow for both operating and capital needs to proceed in 2021. The goods and services being acquired include items such as :

- Parts and services for vehicles and equipment;
- Building Automations System (BAS) and HVAC System maintenance; and
- A variety of licenses, support and service related to the Towns' Information Technology software and hardware.

Single source awards are being requested in most cases to ensure compatibility with existing systems and assets. Annual approvals are requested in order to allow continuity of services and provide transparency in the awards. The amounts presented for each supplier are estimates and align with existing budget approvals and proposed budget amounts for 2021. Award of any amounts related to the 2021 capital program are subject to approval of the 2021 Capital Budget.

Financial Impact

Financial impacts are outlined in detail on the attached Schedules A through H. The resulting funding adjustments are presented on Schedule A, and result in a net overall increase in approved capital budgets of \$1,046.

| Background information | The current contract awarded to Wood for 2021 Asphalt Overlay Design is in the amount of \$294,849 (exclusive of HST). This contract was awarded as a result of the roster process Request for Proposal No. 18-051. There have been no change orders to-date. |
| | The asphalt overlay assessment for the candidate roads that were identified within the RFP were completed by early Fall 2020. After evaluating the results of the geotechnical investigation and the visual assessment during a site visit conducted by Wood's Senior Consultants and Town staff, it was determined that some of the roads identified as experiencing <i>premature deterioration</i> are in fair condition due to the Town proactively implementing the preservative maintenance (crack sealing). As a result, Wood has recommended deferring the asphalt overlay for some of these roads and will continue to monitor them over the next two year period. |
| | As not all roads that are preliminarily identified as potential candidates for Asphalt Overlay and are not necessarily suitable for this treatment. The feasibility and determination of the final program is based on the results of the visual road assessment, Geotechnical and CCTV investigations. To replace the deleted and/or deferred roads, the Town added approximately 4.0 km of roadway to this year's design program. It was also decided to include approximately 4.0 km of additional road in the event some of the selected roads fall outside of the AOL scope, which is determined once the investigations are complete. The study of the additional roads selected is scheduled to be completed in late fall of 2020. |

| Background information | During a scheduled maintenance inspection of the pool air / dehumidification unit at the Sports Centre it was discovered that the copper tube aluminum fin coils in the unit air stream deteriorated beyond repair and required a complete replacement. This condition severely impacts the operation of the equipment therefore negatively affecting the indoor air environment and customers. The pool will not be operable if this unit is not functioning. Emergency repairs have been completed to avoid an unplanned shutdown that would disrupt programming and revenue streams in the future. Moore is an existing vendor, determined through a public tender for the Town's preventative and demand HVAC maintenance work.
