EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- The purpose of this report is to provide information to Council on the Places of Worship Survey undertaken by staff.
- The survey gathers a high-level scan of the profile and concerns of Milton's diverse faith communities.
- Staff is seeking Council direction to consider and incorporate the survey results to formulate updated place of worship policies for Council's consideration.

REPORT

Background

Places of worship play an important role in building communities in Milton. They strengthen community spirits and create a better place to live, work and grow. Currently, the Town of Milton encourages establishing places of worship sites through its land-use policies in the Official Plan.

According to the Canadian polling and market research firm, Environics Analytics, the most recent data shows that Miltonian's religious affiliation comprises of 1% Buddhist, 48% Christian, 3% Anglican, 22% Catholic, 3% United Church, 3% Hindu, 0.3% Jewish, 9% Muslim, 1.6% Sikh, 0.2% other religion and 10.3% no religion.

To take a pulse on our faith community's evolving needs, staff launched the Place of Worship Survey on July 27, 2020 on the Town's website.



Background

The Places of Worship Survey complements the "We Make Milton" Official Plan initiative. The survey results will provide valuable input to develop contemporary places of worship policies in the new Official Plan.

Discussion

To gain a deeper understanding of the challenges faith groups encounter, the survey directed questions to individual faith leaders. Out of the 77 responses received (see Appendix 'A"), 45 were from faith leaders representing 32 different faith groups from all major faith groups in Milton. There were more respondents from newer faith groups than established faith groups. 64% of the respondents have a congregation size of fewer than 300 worshipers

Some of the key findings from faith leaders include:

- 51% of the faith leaders stated that they currently do not have a location for their place of worship.
- 71% of the respondents were primarily looking for a site. Newer faith groups were in greater need of finding a location than established groups.
- 52% of the respondents require an ideal physical size of worship facility of less than 2,000 square meters with 24% needing a facility that is between 3,000 to 5,000 square meters.
- 51% are looking for an ideal site between 0.8 hectares and 1.2 hectares (1 to 3 acres) and 18% require sites that are between 1.6 hectares and 2.02 hectares (4 to 5 acres).

The top barriers to attain suitable sites include:

- Land is too expensive
- Land is not available
- Land use permission not allowed or quoted rental charges challenges

In terms of travel modes to places of worship:

- 60% drive 85% to 100% of the time
- 75% only walk 10% of the time
- 65% do not take public transportation

Generally, 57% of the congregations prefer driving to their place of worship. 22% would walk, 12% take public transportation, 9% use other modes such as carpooling.

Places of worship are generally being used 45% daily and 41% during the weekend. Overall, the usage is at least 41% on weekends and weekdays.



Discussion

The main goal and objective of faith groups for the next 20 years is to serve the community for spiritual needs (prayer, worship, healing) and provide a destination for a community hub for their worshipers' social needs.

Analysis

In accordance with the policies of Milton's current Official Plan, places of worship could potentially be permitted in several land use designations including the following, subject to meeting other policy requirements and any applicable criteria:

- Residential Area
- Residential/Office Area
- Commercial Areas (Central Business District and Downtown Supportive Area)
- Secondary Mixed-use Node
- Employment Area
- Business Park Area
- Institutional Area
- Hamlet Areas

The Town's Zoning By-law 016-2014, permits places of worship in the following zones:

- UGC-MU
- (EMP2)
- M1
- I-A
- I-B

While the Town's current policy and regulatory framework contemplates the accommodation and allocation of places of worship, the survey results clearly articulate the challenges faith groups face in their search for an appropriate site. This includes competing with developers to acquire available land, lack of appropriately sized sites and high parking requirements.

It is important that the Town of Milton have a supportive and flexible policy framework to address the contemporary needs of our faith groups. In recognition of the survey results, this report seeks Council direction to undertake additional analysis through our new Official Plan exercise that would include but not necessarily be limited to the following:

- A best practice policy review of comparable municipalities;
- An analysis of potential site reservation policies;



Discussion

- An analysis of the appropriateness of separate location policies for large and small places of worship (including parking and transportation considerations);
- Opportunities to engage faith groups early in the planning process; and,
- An analysis of accessory and auxiliary uses that define contemporary places of worship as "community hubs".









Are you a local faith leader?


More than half of the respondent were faith leaders



How large is your congregation?







Mode of Travel **60 %**

their place of worship








Mode of Travel 75% will only






How frequent is your place of worship being used?





How large would your ideal place of worship facility need to be? Please state size of physical building in square meters.




