Subject: Street Name Bank Recommendation Report

Recommendation: THAT Report DS-013-22, be APPROVED and;

THAT Council APPROVE the proposed amendment to the Naming Street Policy #70 - 2022, tabled in Appendix 1, to report DS-013-22 and;

THAT Council APPROVE the inclusion of additional street names to the Street Name Bank, tabled in Appendix 'A' to report DS-013-22 and;

THAT Council APPROVE the inclusion of additional street names to the Alternate Street Name Bank, tabled in Appendix 'C' to report DS-013-22 and;

THAT Council RESCIND the Theme Street Names as tabled in Appendix 'D' to report DS-013-22 for the reasons set out in the Staff Report and;

AND THAT Council CONSIDER additional Names for Facilities into the Facility Name Bank, tabled in Appendix 'E' to report DS-013-22.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- On October 25, 2021, Council directed staff to review the street naming policies and report back in early 2022,
- As directed, Staff addressed the use of street names for politicians still in office and the use of street names similar to names in use in other Halton municipalities.
- To address these issues, staff are proposing amendments to the existing Naming Streets Policy #70 as tabled in Appendix 1.

- Staff recommends that the names contained in Appendix "A" -Proposed Street Names, be approved, as they comply with the established evaluation criteria.
- Appendix "B" contains street names nominations that are not recommended for approval, as they do not comply with the established criteria.
- Appendix 'C' contains street names nominations that, subject to Council approval of the proposed amendments to the Naming Street Policy, are recommended to be approved and kept in an Alternate Street Name Bank. They will be considered for future streets allocation after the politician's career ends, or where similar street names in other Halton municipalities no longer challenge the Halton Emergency Partners protocol through the availability of future advanced technologies.
- Staff also recommends that Council rescind all previously approved but unassigned Theme Street Names that do not closely associate with Milton's cultural heritage, history or environment as tabled in Appendix 'D'. These names consist of names under the theme of Canadian Artist, Canadian National Parks and Terrestrial Regions, Ontario Provincial Park, Western Mountains, Ontario Native Trees, Ontario Rivers, Ontario Wildflowers and Provincial/National Canadian place names.
- Town Policy # 69 governs the naming/renaming of Town Owned facilities. These include buildings, parks, seasonal structures, trails, woodlots, building components and park elements. Two 2) names have been submitted for consideration for the Facility Name Bank. Submissions will be reviewed and applications will be administered as per the principles outlined in the Naming/Renaming - Town Owned Facilities Policy.

REPORT

Background

At the meeting of Council on October 25, 2021, several concerns were raised regarding the approval and assignment of specific nominated names in the last report. They are:

1. Approval of nominated street names after politicians who are still in office.
2. Nominated street names that were challenging to pronounce or are duplicated in other Halton municipalities.
3. Theme Street Names previously approved by Council that does not reflect Milton's cultural heritage, history or environment

Discussion

To address the concerns raised by Council, Staff is proposing amendments to Policy No. 070 'Naming - Streets' tabled in Appendix '1', as follows:

4. Establish an **Alternate Street Name Bank** where approved names of politicians still in office and other names that are challenging to pronounce or are duplicated in other Halton municipalities can be kept. These names will only be considered for future streets allocation, subject to the retirement of the politician's career or where similar street names in other Halton municipalities no longer challenge the Halton Emergency Partners protocol through the availability of advanced future technologies. Milton's Fire Chief has indicated that future technologies could eventually eliminate the earlier challenges.
5. Remove the Theme name criteria in its entirety. All previously approved but not assigned Theme Street Names that do not closely associate with Milton's cultural heritage, history or environment be rescinded.

The names in Appendix 'D' consist of previously approved Theme Street Names under the theme of Canadian Artist, Canadian National Parks and Terrestrial Regions, Ontario Provincial Park, Western Mountains, Ontario Native Trees, Ontario Rivers, Ontario Wildflowers and Provincial/National Canadian place names.

6. Other housekeeping revisions to categories, language and description.

Since October 2020, staff has received and reviewed two hundred (200) proposed Street Names. Of these, seventy (70) names meet the policy criteria and are recommended for inclusion into the Street Name Bank subject to Council approval (see Appendix "A").

Street name nominations that do not meet the policy's criteria are listed in Appendix "B." These names are unsuitable as they do not comply with the existing policy's criteria.

Appendix "C" contains street name nominations that do not meet the current policy's criteria. However, subject to Council approval of the proposed amended policy, these names are recommended to be approved but kept in an Alternate Street Name Bank to be considered for future streets allocation subject to the politician's retirement or lifting of the emergency protocol with the advancement of future technologies. The Fire Chief has also advised that the enhanced capabilities of the Next Generation (NG) 911 systems will only be implemented by the **Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission** for the deadline of March 4, 2025.



Council-approved street names may be subject to further review by our emergency service partners at Halton Region. In addition, the lapse of time between Council approval and adopting these names may conflict with other street names already implemented for other Halton municipalities during the adoption period.

It is also recommended that an alternate name bank be established for Council-approved names for active politicians and names that challenges existing Halton Emergencies Partners protocols. These names can then be considered once the impediments have been alleviated.

Naming/Renaming of Town Owned Facilities

Town Policy # 69 governs the naming/renaming of Town Owned facilities. These include buildings, parks, seasonal structures, trails, woodlots, building components and park elements. Two (2) names have been submitted for consideration for the Facility Name Bank. Submissions will be reviewed and applications will be administered as per the principles outlined in the Naming/Renaming - Town Owned Facilities Policy.

Staff further recommends that the names in be considered for the Facility Name Bank.

Financial Impact

There is no financial impact associated with this report.

Recognition of Traditional Lands

The Town of Milton resides on the Treaty Lands and Territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation. We also recognize the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat and Haudenosaunee people. The Town of Milton shares this land and the responsibility for the water, food and resources. We stand as allies with the First Nations as stewards of these lands.

Revised Corporate Policy No. 070: NAMING - Streets

GOALS

1. To establish a process for street naming approval and selection.
2. To assist Council in approving suitable street names for all new streets in Milton by establishing criteria for selecting new street naming within the Town's commercial and residential areas.
3. To maintain a Street Name Bank of approved street names available for selection by the development community.
4. To have an impartial, open and research-based system for selecting the street names that commemorate individuals, including names associated with the neighbourhood's history.
5. To ensure that the honour of naming a street after an individual is maintained as a rare and high honour given only to those who have significantly distinguished themselves through their contribution to the community.

GENERAL

- The Development Services Department shall be responsible for implementing this policy.
- Milton Historical Society representatives will provide properly researched recommendations regarding selecting street names that reflect Milton's cultural heritage.
- All new street names are subject to Council approval.
- Any substantive changes to the street naming criteria or procedures are subject to Council approval and require an amendment to this policy.

STREET NAMING PROCESS

Any person may propose Street Names, including, but limited to, individuals, organizations, elected officials and staff. Street name suggestions shall be submitted to the Development Services Department on the appropriate application form.

CATEGORIES

Street names must comply with one of the following categories:

- Names of Individuals who have distinguished themselves in positions of high office at the Provincial, National or International level.
- Names that recognize local individuals, families or businesses that have made a significant historical contribution to the Town of Milton.

- Names that recognize local history such as events, land uses and cultural landscapes (indigenous, pioneer, ethnic diversity) relative to the Town of Milton and the Regional Municipality of Halton.
- Names that acknowledge the Town's heritage resources, including historic buildings, structures, sites, natural features, local geography and landscapes.
- Names that commemorate war veterans from the Town of Milton. All new street signs used to commemorate veterans shall be marked with a red poppy.
- Names that recognize local citizens and organizations who have had substantial international standing in their chosen discipline or who have made a significant contribution to the community at a provincial or national level.
- The Town reserves the right to remove any approved names at any time, should condition makes it no longer to be in the Town's best interest.

Review by Emergency Service Partners

The Development Services Department will circulate all new street name suggestions to the Milton Fire Services Department, who will review and circulate them to other Halton Regional emergency service partners. The purpose is to address the potential duplication of street names within the Region, ease of pronunciation and spelling, and the potential for each suggested name being mistaken for other similar street names within the Region.

Other New Street Name Requirements

Street names should be short in length, easy to spell and easy to pronounce.

New street names shall generally be one word except for special circumstances such as historical or geographic name recognition purposes.

Commemorative names should be based on only the surname of an individual. However, it is noted that some individuals have common surnames. When this occurs, consideration may be given to using an individual's full name. The use of full names (i.e. first name and surname) will be generally limited to provincial or national significance.

Names not permitted

The Town will not permit street names that:

- Are too long (Ideally, names should not exceed ten characters in length)
- Are challenging to pronounce or could easily be mistaken for another street name.
- Are challenging to spell.
- Have unconventional spellings and do not accommodate ease of recognition and pronunciation.

- Contain apostrophes, hyphens and dashes. The possessive may be used but without the use of the apostrophe.
- Could be construed to promote alcohol, tobacco or other addictive substances, pornography, weapons or other life-threatening products.
- Present demeaning or derogatory portrayals of individuals or groups or contain any message likely to offend.
- Could be construed to have sexual overtones, inappropriate humour, parody, slang or a double meaning.
- Promote religious or political messages that might be deemed prejudicial to other religious or political groups.
- Could be construed as advertising a product, business, commercial enterprise or religious institution.
- Contain words that have already been excessively used in the Milton community.

APPROVAL

All suggested street names will be included in a report to Council that will consist of:

- the reasons for the suggestion;
- an assessment of whether it complies with the Street Naming Policy;
- a recommendation as to whether it should be approved or refused; and
- a recommendation as to whether it should be restricted to a particular area and the reason(s) for this.

All names approved by Council will be added to the Street Name Bank and made available for selection. Names that Council does not support will not be added to the street name bank. The Council decision is final.

SELECTION OF STREET NAMES

The Street Name Bank is an approved list of available street names. In addition, any suggested street names that have been approved by the Council (and upon completion of consultation with the Halton Regional emergency service partners) will be included in the Street Name Bank.

The Street Name Bank may also include locational restrictions related to particular street names.

The development community must first use any Historical Names that Council has determined appropriate for the new development area.

Council approval is not required for any names selected from the Street Name Bank, provided the location criteria have been complied with.

ALTERNATE STREET NAME DATABASE

An alternate street name database shall be kept for:

1. Nominated street names approved by Council for a public figure still in Office. These names shall only be allocated to new streets once the public figures term of office has ended.
2. Nominated street names approved by the Council that the current emergency system does not permit due to the use of a name already in use elsewhere in the Region of Halton or conflicts with the present emergency response protocols. These names shall be considered for allocation only when the appropriate emergency response system technology has been implemented.
