Subject: Implementation of All-Way Stop - McLaughlin Avenue and

Asleton Boulevard

Recommendation: THAT a By-law be enacted to amend the Uniform Traffic Control

By-law 1984-1, as amended, to implement an all-way stop at the intersection of McLaughlin Avenue and Asleton Boulevard;

REPORT

Background

As a result of staff receiving several inquiries requesting the implementation of an all-way stop at the intersection of McLaughlin Avenue and Asleton Boulevard, turning movement counts were conducted.

Residents surrounding the intersection of McLaughlin Avenue and Asleton Boulevard informed Traffic Engineering staff of personal property (parked vehicles on the boulevard) getting hit by cars turning from Asleton Boulevard onto McLaughlin Avenue. This has occurred four times within the last year, although these were not reported to Halton Regional Police.

Discussion

McLaughlin Avenue and Asleton Boulevard All-Way Stop Justification

The intersection of McLaughlin Avenue and Asleton Boulevard is a three-legged intersection within an urban area. McLaughlin Avenue is a collector roadway running east/west between Asleton Boulevard and Santa Maria Boulevard with a posted speed limit of 50 km/h. Asleton Boulevard is also a collector roadway running north/south between Leiterman Drive and Transom Crescent/ Megson Terrace, with a posted speed limit of 50 km/h.

As a result of resident requests, the intersection of McLaughlin Avenue and Asleton Boulevard has been monitored since 2018 and the results were as follows:

Count Date	Part "A"	Part "B"

June 11, 2019	73%	96%
February 15, 2022	100%	100%

The warrants consider the overall volume of traffic entering the intersection during the peak traffic times, as well as the volume of traffic and pedestrians generated from the side street. In order for an all-way stop to be warranted by volume, both Parts "A" and "B" must equal 100%. Since both Part "A" and Part "B" of the most recent count equals 100%, this location is warranted for the installation of an all-way stop.

Willmott Neighbourhood Park is located just south of McLaughlin Avenue and Asleton Boulevard. Installing an all-way stop will provide a protected crossing for pedestrians and will regulate the right-of-way at the intersection.

A three-year collision analysis has been completed and it has been determined that there have been no reported collisions at this intersection.

As a result of both Part "A" and Part "B" of the warrant being fulfilled at the intersection of McLaughlin Avenue and Asleton Boulevard, staff recommends the installation of an all-way stop.

Financial Impact

The cost to install the appropriate signage and pavement markings is approximately \$600.00 and is provided for within the 2022 Operating Budget.
