THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT staff give consideration for increased signage, a strategic communications plan focused on public safety and awareness, as well as the creation of a by-law related to the prohibited activities at or around stormwater management ponds and report back to Council appropriately via a staff report, and through sharing of public service announcements and social media messaging.
