Recommendation:	THAT Council objects to the use of Milburough Line between Derry Road and 11 <sup>th</sup> Concession East as a designated truck route;
	AND THAT a copy of DS-066-21 entitled City of Hamilton Truck Master Plan be forwarded to the City of Hamilton and the Region of Halton.

### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The City of Hamilton is in the process of conducting a Truck Route Master Plan review.

Milburough Line is one of the alternatives being considered through the Class Environmental Assessment. Due to the poor road geometrics, safety concerns and environmental considerations, among other matters, Infrastructure staff does not support the use of Milburough Line between Derry Road and 11<sup>th</sup> Concession East as a designated truck route.

### Background

The City of Hamilton has been conducting the Truck Route Master Plan (TRMP) review. The study is exploring opportunities to advance the safe and efficient passage of trucks in Hamilton, to support economic activities and the movement of goods while balancing the needs of residents and communities. The master plan will recommend an updated truck route network and will outline supporting policies and strategies.

On June 9, 2021 the City of Hamilton held a second Truck Route Master Plan ("TRMP") Update - Adjacent Municipalities and MTO Stakeholder Meeting. At this meeting a DRAFT truck route plan was presented which involves the use of Milburough Line

between Derry Road and 11<sup>th</sup> Concession East. This section of Milburough Line is a boundary road between the City of Hamilton and the Town of Milton.

This study is being conducted in accordance with the requirements of Phases 1 and 2 of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment, which is an approved process under the *Ontario Environmental Assessment Act*.

#### Discussion

After the above meeting took place on June 9, 2021, residents in the area of Milburough Line were delivered a notice to participate in Virtual Public Information Centre #2 on June 24, 2021 (Appendix I). Between June 17 - July 9, 2021 information related to the TRMP was available for review by residents on the City of Hamilton's project web page: <a href="https://engage.hamilton.ca/TRMP">https://engage.hamilton.ca/TRMP</a>.

After this notice was delivered, the Town began to receive a number of emails directly from residents and through members of Council objecting to the use of Milburough Line between Derry Road and 11<sup>th</sup> Concession.

Town of Milton - Traffic Engineering staff has reviewed the information provided by the City of Hamilton and subsequently submitted the following questions and comments to the City of Hamilton objecting to the use of Milburough Line.

- Please provide rationale to confirm why this specific segment has been added to the Truck Route Plan. What has changed since the 2010 Hamilton Truck Master Plan that is driving the need to add Milburough Line to this link?;
- Milburough Line between Derry Road and 11<sup>th</sup> Concession East is a boundary road shared by the City of Hamilton and the Town of Milton. Any modifications to this road must conform to the current Boundary Road Agreement. These boundary road agreements usually exclude capital improvements. Capital improvements are negotiated amongst the municipalities. In this case if Milton has no interest in improving the road then any capital improvements should be fully funded by the City of Hamilton;
- Milburough Line is a 6m wide road which is not suitable for truck traffic. There are no shoulders on this roadway, however there are a number of blind spots, hidden driveways and sharp curves;
- Milburough Line is lined with a number of large trees;



### Discussion

- There is also a grade-level crossing of the CN Railroad with only flashing light warnings, however no gates;
- Milburough Line between Carlisle Road and Derry Road is subject to a seasonal (Mar 1 - Apr 30) reduced load truck;
- Has the Environmental Study Report (ESR) for this initiative been filed with Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP)? If so please provide the date of filing.

The City of Hamilton has acknowledged that they have received a number of comments from local residents stating their objection to the use of Milburough Line.

The City of Hamilton has indicated that the DRAFT recommended truck route network is subject to change based on the feedback received and further technical analysis. Public and stakeholder feedback is an integral part of this study and will inform the steps path forward. Any comments that the Town or local residents have submitted will be taken into consideration during the process of coming up with a preferred alternative.

If the Town's and residents' concerns are not heeded, when the Environmental Study Report is filed with the Ministry of the Environment Conservation and Parks, the Town can request the Minister for a Part II order, along with our stated objection.

A Part II order can be requested when it is felt that significant outstanding issues have not been addressed through a class environmental assessment process and could be better addressed through an individual environmental assessment process. An individual environmental assessment process provides a higher level of assessment. Anyone can request a Part II order.

### **Financial Impact**

There is no financial impact associated with this report.
