Res. 152-21: WHEREAS thousands of plastic lawn signs are produced during each election cycle at great personal expense to the candidates and their

AND WHEREAS these 'sign wars' provide an unfair advantage of wealthier candidates and incumbents who can raise money;

supporters, with the majority being discarded following the election;

AND WHEREAS putting an end to the election "sign war" would help level the playing-field for all candidates regardless of financial means;



AND WHEREAS reducing election signs will prevent more plastics from entering our environment, trails and waterways;

AND WHEREAS sign wars further help incumbents as they are able to reuse signs from the previous election while new candidates have to spend money for new signs;

AND WHEREAS prohibiting signs on public roadways in Burlington did not stop 6 out of 7 candidates being elected to new positions with 5 being completely new to the elected office, demonstrating that banning signs on public properties did not hurt new candidates;

AND WHEREAS municipalities around us, such as Mississauga, Brampton and Burlington already prohibit the use of election signs on public roadways;

AND WHEREAS enforcing rules around the use of signs on public properties costs taxpayers money in bylaw enforcement and wastes valuable staff time better spent on more important issues;

AND WHEREAS Milton residents consistently ask for election signs to be banned or prohibited outright or at least restricted to private properties only, and online polls have consistently found the support to be over 90%;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT staff be directed to bring forward a report with respect to sign friendly zones and legal considerations for the prohibiting the placement of election signs on public property.
