As detailed in the report, there is strong opposition to this decision from the local community, as well as no confirmed plan for what to do with 600+ displaced children (vs. the 100+ high school students being accommodated for). Additionally - the report has increased the time to 2 years for the proposal instead of 1 year as stated in the HCDSB's application. If this is voted to proceed, the neighbourhood has NOT been informed of this in any external communications aside from the technical report that was published mere days before the vote. It doesn't feel right that so many people have spoken up in opposition to this proposal, yet the recommendation is to proceed and for a longer period that publicly stated. It is clear that the staff recommendation is written to the benefit of the HCDSB, rather than the communities best interests. The outspokenness of the community is not from a position of self-interest... it is coming from an understanding of how this will displace children as young as 4 years old, who will be forced to change schools, be bussed across neighbourhoods, and suffer mentally from a period in their life where they are needing a stable environment to develop and grow.
