EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- The Milton Education Village (MEV) is a key strategic initiative that supports our future growth, the achievement of our corporate Strategic Plan and our Vision of Milton in 2051.
- Construction activity on the Milton Education Village has commenced with site readiness work underway by Wilfrid Laurier University and Phase 1 construction by Schlegel Villages.
- Conestoga College and Wilfrid Laurier University have secured interim spaces across Milton to commence offering post-secondary academic programming.
- Three campuses are now open with a combined capacity of over 3,000 students.

REPORT

Background

In the early 1990's the Town identified the need to attract post-secondary educational institutions to the community and in 2007 the Town began to assess the potential of municipally owned lands as a local post-secondary campus location with related and complementary uses.

Since that time, work has progressed with a range of academic, landowner and government partners to plan for the property to the west of urban Milton to become a complete transitoriented community centred around a large academic post-secondary campus with

complimentary commercial, residential and community use space, The Milton Education Village (MEV).

Discussion

2024 has seen Wilfrid Laurier University continue with their site works to prepare for a future ground-breaking while Schlegel Villages has commenced construction and broken ground on phase one of their Villages of Ridgeview Court Long Term Care/Independent Living Facility.

Coordinated land planning work with the landowner group has continued with particular focus on the Sub-Watershed Impact Study (SIS). During its development and review landowners have continued to refine their neighbourhood and campus masterplans.

Interim Campus Spaces

2024 saw Conestoga College and Wilfrid Laurier University launch three interim campus spaces.

- Conestoga College Park Hill Campus
- Conestoga College Steele Ave Campus
- Wilfrid Laurier Laurier Milton Academic Centre

May 2024 saw Conestoga College open its Steeles Avenue Campus which is a Centre of Excellence in Health and offers a range of healthcare focused programming in experiential lab



Discussion

These campuses are fully operational and offer a range of post-secondary degree, diploma and certificate programming. Across all campus locations Milton now has capacity for approximately 3,100 post-secondary students.

To facilitate student movement around the community, the Town has entered into a transit partnership with both post-secondary institutions which has seen investments into our Milton Transit service. Route 1 offers conventional transit service connecting our three campus locations to the Milton Go Station and the 401 Park and Ride. To coincide with this Milton Transit has also introduced a reduced cost transit pass for students.

Strategic Alignment

'Planned Community Growth' is a key strategic theme as identified within the Town's Strategic Plan; with the MEV a key driver of this community growth. Staff have recently completed a mid-point evaluation of the Town's economic development strategic plan which shows continued growth in the Professional, Technical and Scientific sector as well as growth across the Finance & Insurance and Healthcare sectors. Future attraction and business expansion aligned to these growth sectors will require the development of suitable non-residential space. The Milton Education Village is an ideal location for these sectors given the community and neighbourhood assets that will exist
