Subject: Recommendation Report - Notice of Intention to Rename existing portions of Tremaine Road to Gaetan Road and Troop Point

- Recommendation:**
- **THAT** Staff Report DS-028-26 entitled: “Recommendation Report - Notice of Intention to Rename existing portions of Tremaine Road to Gaetan Road and Troop Point” be received;
 - **THAT** Council approves the street name change from Tremaine Road to Gaetan Road and Troop Point;
 - **AND FURTHER THAT** once the twenty-day objection period has expired and if there are no objections, a road renaming by-law be brought forward for Council adoption.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- Halton Region has proposed designating the newly constructed road as Tremaine Road. This resulted in the need to rename the existing Tremaine Road, North and South of Campbellville Road.
- As the name change is initiated at the request of Halton Region, Staff at Halton Region agreed to issue a Notice of Street Renaming to inform property owners about the upcoming street renaming, and to administer the feedback received from the public in relation to the proposed renaming.
- The proposed names for the existing road north of 401 is Troop Point and south of 401 is Gaetan Road.
- Section 48 of the Municipal Act, S.O. 2001, Ch. 25 and Town policy No.135 as amended, authorizes the Council of a municipality to pass by-laws respecting roads and naming or changing the name of a road



REPORT

Background

Section 48 of the Municipal Act, S.O. 2001, Ch. 25, and Town policy No.135 authorizes Council to name or rename roads by by-law.

In response to Halton Region's request to change the name of Tremaine Road in Milton Heights, Staff recommends that the portion of Tremaine Road south of Highway 401 be changed to **Gaetan Road** and the portion north of Highway 401 be renamed **Troop Point**. Gaetan Road will loop into the new subdivision road network, and Troop Point will terminate in a cul-de-sac.

The east portion of Tremaine Road north of Campbellville Road is within Halton Hills' jurisdiction, requiring a similar renaming process by their Council.

Appendices 1 and 2 show the road portions to be renamed.

Gaetan is proposed for its local significance; Gaetan land was donated to Conservation Halton by the founding members of the Italian Canadian Club.

Troop is proposed to commemorate Robert Troop Hill (1819-1890), an early settler and sawmill operator in Peru, connected to the Hill and Huffman families, both early land grant recipients.

Discussion

Halton Region posted a public notice of street renaming- PR-2261C (See Appendix 3) on February 26, 2026. Three responses were received to the notices, and one of the respondents suggested adopting the name "Carton" for the portion of the road North of the 401.

Staff has included the nominated name "Carton" in a separate report for inclusion into the street name bank. However, Staff does not recommend the adoption of this name as the portion of Tremaine Road beyond Campbellville Road is a joint jurisdiction road, and any deviation from the published notice will require the consent from both Councils, and a new notice to be circulated.



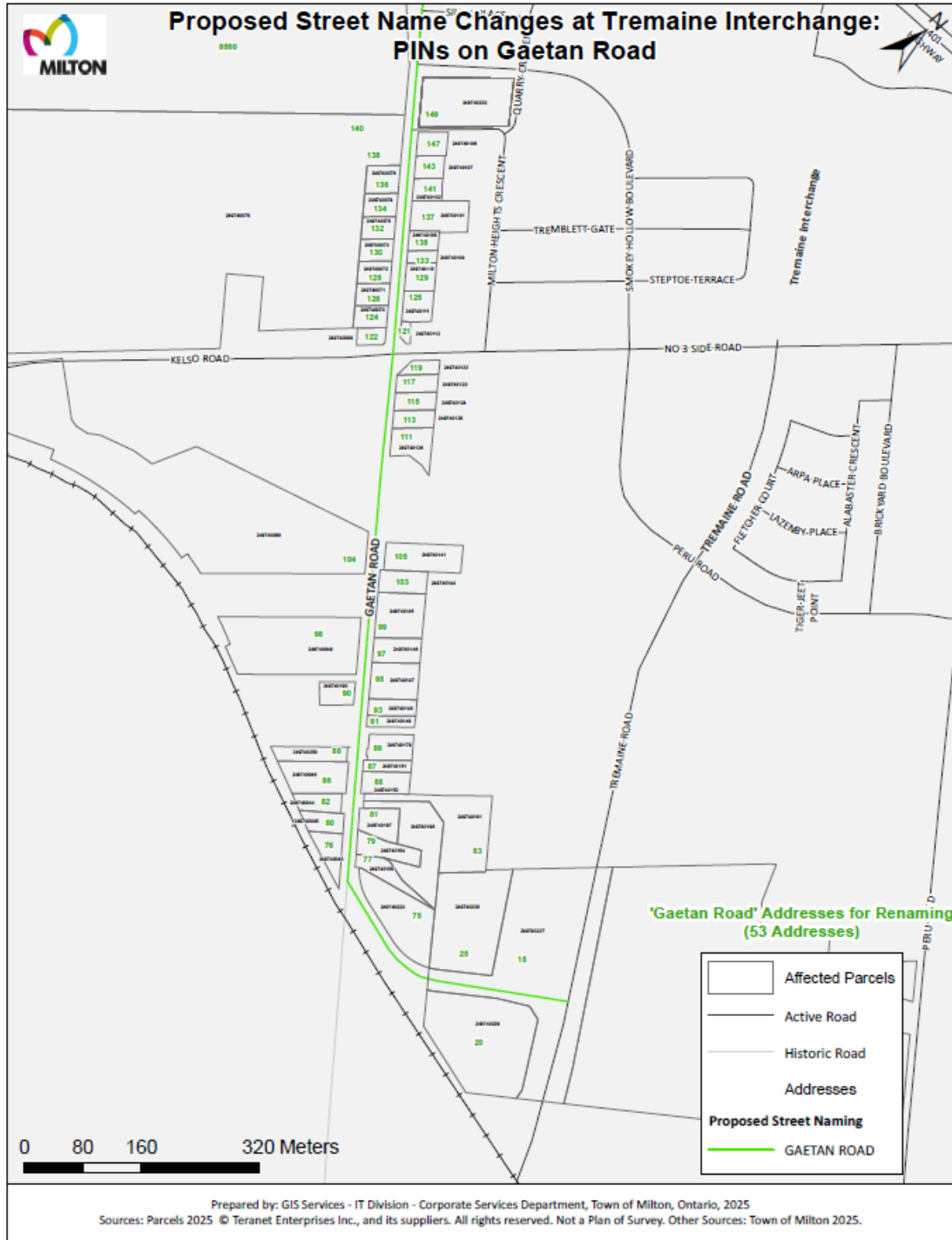

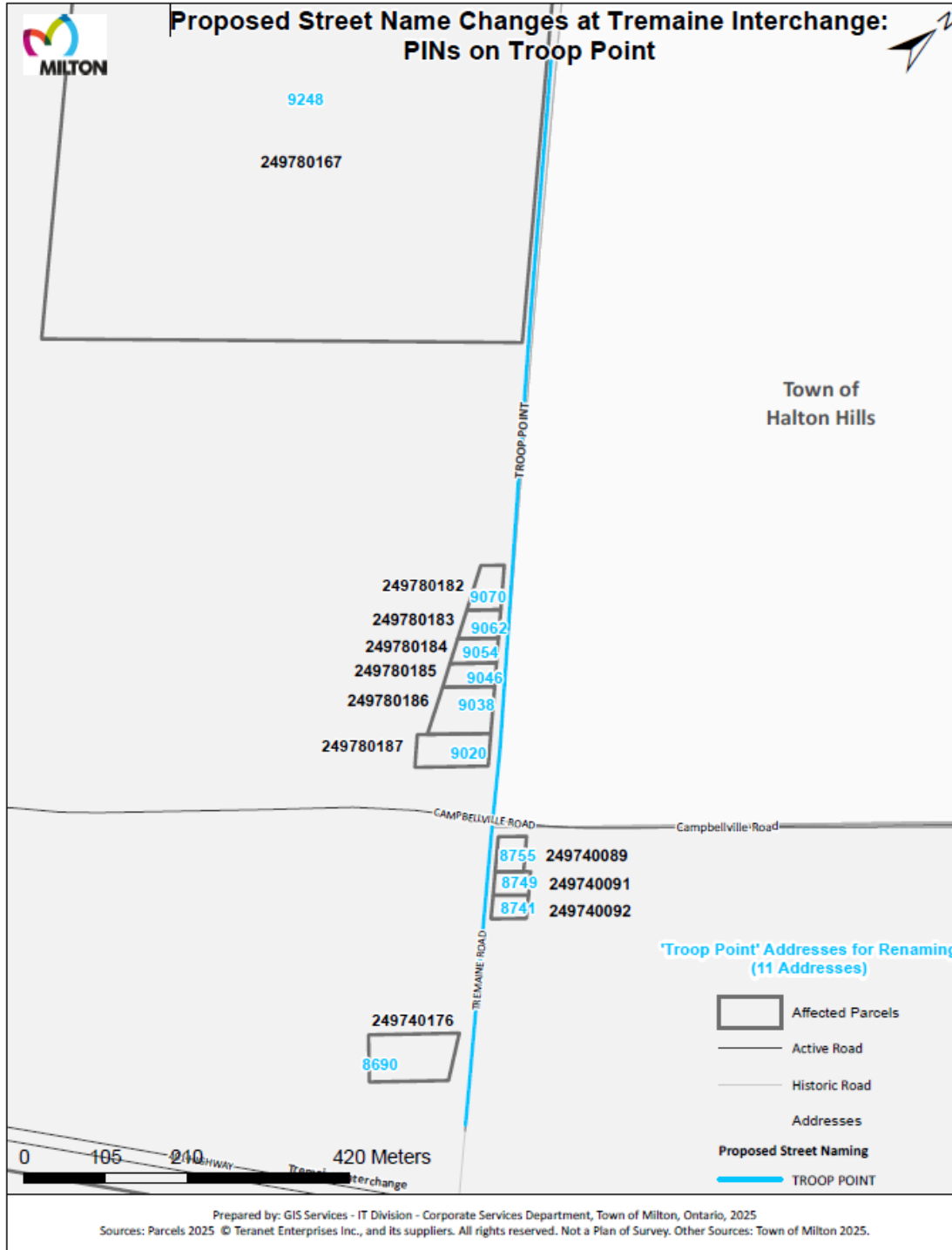

Notice of Street Renaming – PR-2261C

About This Project

Halton Region is continuing work on the final phase (Contract 3) of the Tremaine Road (Reg. Rd. 22) improvements project. This work extends from Steeles Avenue (Reg. Rd. 8) to Campbellville Road, between Ward 1 in the Town of Milton and Ward 2 in the Town of Halton Hills. Construction for this project started in August 2023 and is expected to be completed by December 2026.

STREET RENAMING

We would like to inform you that your municipal address will change as part of a proposed street renaming. We are working closely with the Town of Milton and Town of Halton Hills to complete the official street renaming process.

Halton Region will designate the newly constructed road as Tremaine Road (Reg. Rd. 22) once both municipalities pass the required by-law.

At that time, a portion of the existing Tremaine Road will transition from being a Regional road to a local municipal road and will be renamed according to your municipality's street-renaming process.

As proposed, the portion of the existing Tremaine Road located south of Highway 401 will be renamed **Gaetan Road**, and the portion north of Highway 401- including the area extending beyond Campbellville Road - will be renamed **Troop Point**. A detailed map showing these street limits is attached for your reference.

This renaming is needed to reflect new infrastructure, including the realigned road and future Highway 401 interchange. These changes will support clearer addresses, easier navigation, and more efficient emergency response.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. When will my address officially change?

- We anticipate that the process will be completed by September 2026 after both the municipalities pass their respective renaming by-laws and all street signs are updated.

Q. How will we be informed about the address change?

- After the Town of Milton and Town of Halton Hills pass their by-law, you will receive detailed notice with pertinent information and the next steps. Your municipality will automatically notify your utility and postal services.

Q. How was my street name chosen?

- The street name was selected from the municipalities' Council-approved Street Name Bank, which recognizes local history, veterans, and community contributors. More information is available on the Town of Milton website.

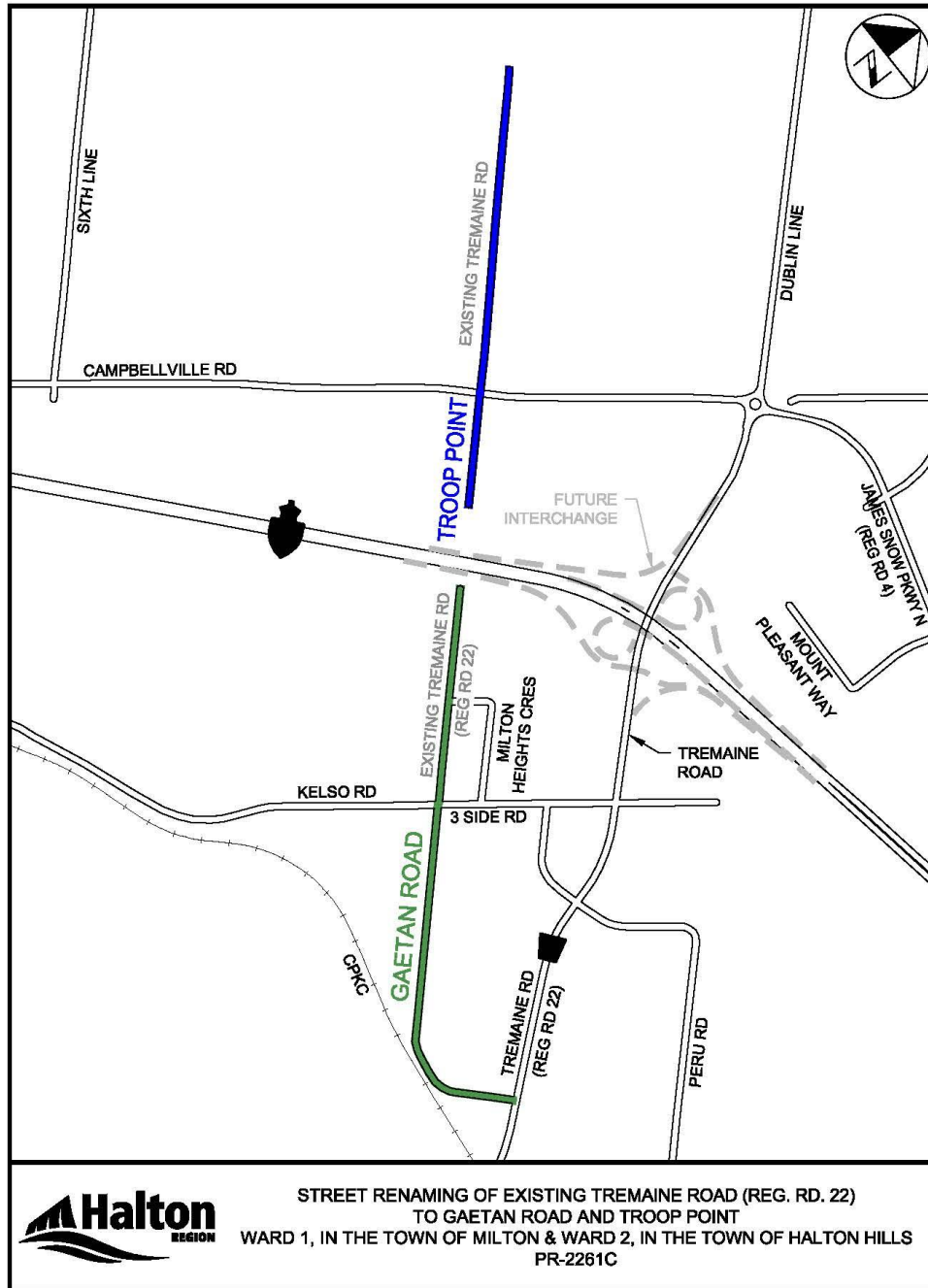
